Dear Mr Bradley,

Professor Borysiewicz has passed your email of 16 January to me for a reply.

As you will be aware, the planning application to which you refer dates back some time. Principally the College objected to the original application on the grounds of health and safety due to the poor road crossing arrangements associated with the development. We did however make it clear at the time that if the local authority had agreed to install a pedestrian crossing, our objections could have been alleviated.

In addition, if the applicant in question had proposed a different entrance route I can assure you we would not have lodged our formal objection.

Turning to the objection on flood lighting, this was raised because the original application referred to operating hours of 08h30-17h30 Monday to Friday and it was not understood why it was necessary to install flood lighting, purely to save 1 hour of daylight in winter months.

As you know, our plans for a science park in Wye are at an early stage and we will take into account such issues in making our own proposals. As you can see, with some minor amendments, this scheme could have proceeded.

I hope this has addressed your enquiry.
